# Bishop Vanuel Charles Little, Sr. & Dr. Alice M Little

As non-evocative as they may appear, the words Sumter, Vigo, Cook, and Oklahoma, all have a common theme? The not so elusive association are all names of the counties accommodating four relative cities in which two nobles were born, raised, and subsisted for years totaling 84 and 82. Highly favored and graciously chosen of God, these spiritual pioneers are, without doubt, an integral design of indisputable divine providence. The scrutinizing gaze of the eyes of history have now affirmed and reaffirmed the definitive marks of divine fingerprints wholly over the lives of the Honorables - Bishop Vanuel Charles Little, Sr. and Dr. Alice Marie Little.

Sumter County, Panola, Alabama, was a tiny township situated midway on the north to south Alabama vertical plane lying just east of the Mississippi line. Having a meager sharecropping population situated in Deep South petty prejudices and racial segregations, yet it was a place chosen and groomed to rear a native son appointed to greatness. On Thursday, July 6, 1933 in a humble homestead environment, as employed by the Midwifery of the day, was born a healthy baby boy, Vanuel Charles Little, as named by his proud God fearing parents, the Reverend Andrew Little and Mrs. Mable Almeta Little.



As young Vanuel grew-up and became aware of the challenges of the times, he recalls the day his father, affectionately called Papa, intervened on his behalf by abruptly pulling him away from a conflict with another young lad who had become rude and indignant while in the country store. Many of his peers were aware of his

sharp leadership skills and his incapacity for allowing the play-acting of wrong without voicing his dissent. That being said, one can understand why his father chose to remove him from the scene as he was just about to tell the other, much younger boy (of a privileged southern background) of his senseless aggression and rudeness in blocking passage as he only attempted simply to pass around. When Vanuel maneuvered around him, he vented words of his displeasure but no



retort was necessary, as Papa had already taken charge of the situation. Vanuel was one also known for staying close to his mom as she baked many treats in the kitchen sharing them with the gratefully modest lingering near.

While growing up in the farming community of Panola, young Vanuel affectionately called Van by his family and friends was a well-mannered youth. Often he conveys his tender memories regarding his father's uncanny capacity towards fairness in treating all of his children with utmost respect, individuality, and needed privacy. He sites his mother's mild soft-spoken manner and her perpetual loyalty to his father's family leadership as fond memoir. He recounts one of many of her favorite emphases to the queries of the day as "Whatever '<u>lil Andrew'</u> says goes".



Soon the dusty sun parched fields and hot hills of Panola seemed to offer little economic gain. With the blessing of his parents, Vanuel began his journey northward to Chicago, Illinois where jobs and opportunity seemed to await. It was there that he found useful employment and would soon discover ultimate opportunity, salvation! Soon the devout son of a Methodist Pastor would find himself, as the song goes, in a meeting one night...

Vigo County, Terre Haute, Indiana, was a small town named by French settlers meaning "High land" – due in part to it's positioning on the walloping Wabash River and it's designation as county seat. Amazingly, its global positioning not only gave forth its name designation but also declared the birth and residence of one destined for greatest. In this industry driven town on a special weekend day, Friday, September 7, 1934 in the Maternity Ward of St. Anthony's Hospital was born Alice Marie Stevens, the seventh of eight siblings. The proud parents were Mr. Elzia Stevens and Mrs. Ada Belle Stevens. The unwavering faith and trust in God of her mother impacted her young life significantly. She too received Christ on Sunday, January 4, 1948 at the

tender age of thirteen (13). She recalls the tremendous work ethics instilled in her from the great strides of her mother. Her simple goal was to prepare her for a life of promise and professional education over and beyond the trappings of the present day that yielded to meager mediocrity. As a young adult, Alice was blessed to receive





even further spiritual nurturing in the residence of the Assistant Pastor of the Apostolic Church of God in Chicago, Illinois, Elder Elmer Clemmons, Jr. and Lady Daisy Clemmons. She speaks passionately of the loving care and guidance given her while in the home of her second parents. Even now she says seldom does a week pass without the friendship of Lady Clemmons who she affectionately calls, Aunt Daisy, conversing several times a week per long distance calls.

The Midwestern region of the country, specifically the second largest county, by populace, in the United States: Cook County, Chicago, Illinois, was where divine

providence was revealed as the two spiritual nomads converged, aligned in the same church. Little did the two realize, at that time, the distinct nature of God's intentional high order slated upon their lives, as they'd become an effective ordained duo position to become fishers of men and women of all walks of life everywhere. On November 10, 1955 there was a worship service at the Apostolic Church of God in Chicago, IL. Vanuel had been visiting a few churches and had received an invitation to attend Apostolic. He went to the Thursday night service and the rest became history, as the song suggests, 'something got a hold of him'. He was filled that night with the precious Holy Ghost after having been baptized in Jesus name earlier. Life for young Vanuel became brand new, even on his job where he began to witness to all and tell of his newfound faith. Many came to Christ hearing his witness. He fondly recalls his posting of 'Jesus Saves' signs on the walls of his factory job. As a consequence of his zeal, employment again was needed. Soon his zeal was integrated with knowledge of the Word of God and the call to the ministry soon became evident under the pastoral leadership of District Elder Walter Clemmons.

Soon Minister Little met Sister Alice Stevens and they grew very fond of each other as both were working faithfully in the same church ministries. Within time they were married on September 22, 1956 and later from that union three (3) children were born. They are now the proud parents of three anointed children: Firstborn - Ada M. Little,



second born - Vanuel Charles Little, Jr. and the youngest - Victor Carl Little, I.

During Minister Little's spiritual sojourn at the Apostolic Church of God, his evangelical outreach progressed into countless souls being lead to Christ including his own immediate family back in Alabama. He went back and forth preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ as his entire clan of siblings and eventually his mother and later his father also had fully received the baptism in Jesus name and the Holy Spirit speaking in tongues.




At the untimely death of his pastor, the late District Elder Walter Clemons, Minister Little secured his allegiance with and dedication to the newly ordained pastor, Elder Arthur M. Brazier. He soon became elevated to Assistant Pastor following his ministerial licensing and ordination. The next twenty years serving spent in these capacities and in the Illinois District Council and as a PAW National Evangelist. He had already faithfully

served as Choir Director, Altar Worker, Youth Vice President and President (local and state), Custodian, and many other hard working capacities. He and his wife, Sister Little spearheaded the "Task Force" outreach ministry which aided in countless souls being added to the kingdom.



In excess of he seven years traveled extensively National a Evangelist, traveling, weekly flying across the globe became this routine over course of his ministry. during Also, his evangelical experience on the field, after having the



honor of baptizing his parents and siblings, he was invited to baptize his 97 years of age grandmother in the Precious Name of Jesus as she too received the Holy Ghost. Elder Little had made a tremendous impact in the lives of his entire family and friends. One of few, yet rare pinnacles and defining momentous seismic shifts in his life occurred while attending to his mom on her deathbed. Only one year after her


salvation, she declared to him gratitude of having a son in the flesh that had also become her father in the gospel.

In October 1973, upon the inspired recommendation of the discerning Oklahoma Diocesan, Bishop Robert W. McMurray, Elder Little was elected Pastor of the First





Deliverance Church located 2201 N.E. 15th Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. At that time, the membership was approximately 35-40 members, mostly children. Approximately one year later, Elder and Sister Little received their doctorate degrees in Theology and Sacred Letters along with many other honorary and scholastic achievements.



First Deliverance Church soon became Greater First Deliverance Temple in March 1985 as the entire membership moved into its newly constructed, fully equipped church facility at, 2101 N. Bryant Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The Temple is presently valued in excess of \$2 million plus. The sanctuary consists of two levels with a seating capacity of fifteen hundred, an roomy elaborate educational wing, and a state of

the art multi-purpose room facilitating a plethora of events ranging from formal banqueting to the hosting of sporting events and basketball tournaments.

In August of 1988, he became the C.E.O. and Founder of the Greater First Deliverance Temple Bible College, which opened in. These classes were designed for those desiring to enhance and develop their Christian Education experience. Upon completion of a two-year degree program, students will have earned an Associate Degree in Theology. Dr. Little incorporated the "Bread of Life Ministries" in the church program. This program was designed to feed those in need of physical food as well

as spiritual food. This program is supported on a donation basis by the membership. He also engaged in vast Prison Ministries, which takes the gospel to those in places of confinement.

Dr. Vanuel C. Little was appointed District Elder by the Honorable, Bishop Robert W. McMurray, Oklahoma Diocesan. Dr. Little became the first to be elected to the official position. He served as he was reelected again and again for the next 3 terms of 2-year periods each. The Official Board enacted newly approved term span conversions of three (3) years per term and again Bishop Little became the choice of the voting council populace for the forth time. He progressed onward to become elected as PAW Lay Director, serving two terms. At that



time, Bishop William L. Smith had become the Bishop of the Oklahoma Diocese. Dr. Little often recalls the father/son relationship of unbreakable bonding. Dr. Little cherished their alliance and relishes the honor of having been chosen of God to have had yet another highly favored ambassador/mentor of leadership in his life.

Then, in March 1989 in the city of West Palm Beach, Florida, the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc elected Dr. Little to the office of Bishop. In August of that same year, in Louisville, KY, Bishop Little was anointed in holy consecration by then Presiding Prelate Bishop James A. Johnson. Bishop Little was appointed overseer of the 36th Episcopal District (the Eastern Caribbean Council of Nations) of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World as installation ceremonies took place in January 1990 on the island of Montserrat, Bishop James A. Johnson officiating. In attendance were Bishop and First Lady William L. Smith, Bishop and First Lady Heron Johnson, Evang. Matera Bumpus, Dr. Chuck and Lady Catherine Little, Evang. Easter Hilbert, and First Lady Wilma Ellis who also contributed a sizable monetary gift of love to the cause of the Gospel.

A few years later, Diocesan of Oklahoma, the treasured Bishop William L. Smith made the decision to proceed to the position of Emeritus, leaving vacant the Diocesan position. The leadership baton was passed to the honorable Bishop Little



and in August of 1992 Bishop Little was reappointed as Diocesan of the Oklahoma State Council 26th Episcopal District of the P.A.W. by then presiding Prelate, Bishop Paul A. Bowers. In the same year, during the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc.'s Annual Convention in Chicago, IL, Bishop Little was elevated to the Board of Directors of the Bishops of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc.

On October 20, 1993, Bishop Little was installed as again receiving the leadership baton from the treasured Bishop William L. Smith, Emeritus?

Bishop Little is seen and heard each Sunday proclaiming the gospel through "Telecast and Radio Ministries" in Oklahoma and surrounding areas. Bishop Little's web page address is www.GFDT.org.

With all these accomplishments and responsibilities, Bishop Little has remained a "man of humility". He loves the charge God has given him to "Feed the Flock" which the Holy Ghost has made him overseer.
